Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, was called to order at 8:01 a.m. by President Langer.

Approval of Minutes Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on

March 25, 2015.

Executive Committee

Commissioner Knutsen reported that the Executive Committee met on April 17, 2015 to review and approve the April 22, 2015 board meeting agenda. No action was taken.

Board Finance Committee

The committee met on April 15, 2015. Ms. King reviewed the financial statements and cash activity for March 2015 (E:24:15). Commissioner Williams asked what comprises "other income." Ms. King explained that this includes interest income, unrealized gains on investments, and the annual M&O levy.

Ms. King provided a breakdown of projected income for 2015 (from the M&O levy, Kruger Clinic, etc.) as requested

by Commissioner Williams.

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Authorization for Payment of Vouchers & Payroll Warrant Numbers 11054 through 11086 for March 2015 for payment in the amount of \$67,786.59 were presented for approval (E:25:15). *Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve.* 

Resolution 2015:03 Surplus Property Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve Resolution 2015:03 determining certain personal property to be surplus and no longer required for public hospital district purposes of the District and authorizing the Superintendent or his designee to sell all or any part of such property.

Program Oversight Committee Update The Program Oversight Committee met on April 17, 2015 and reviewed five application requests; four new and one renewal (E:26:15).

No conflicts of interest were reported by any of the commissioners.

### **New Funding Applications:**

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve the Edmonds Community College Celebration of Food Festival in May 2015 in the amount of \$5,000 on a one-time basis.

### Not recommended for funding:

Washington State University Extension – FoodSense multiyear request for a total of \$477,000 to implement the FoodSense nutrition education curriculum in the Edmonds School District. The project is relatively expensive and the Edmonds School District has not yet embraced the project.

Rotary Club of Edmonds – Edmonds Waterfront Festival request for \$7,500 to fund the annual festival in May 2015. Although it is a large community event, the festival is not particularly connected to health.

Sound Health Physicians – Diabetes Program multi-year request from a Lynnwood medical clinic to support patients dealing with diabetes. The program is more focused on disease management than Verdant typically funds and the project is built around a single clinical practice.

### Program Renewal Request:

Senior Services of Snohomish County – Care Coordination. The program exceeded its goal for referrals in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the program. The committee is recommending

renewing the project in full at \$135,000 per year for two additional years. *Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously* to approve the \$135,000 per year for two additional years.

Verdant Community Wellness Center Activities Ms. Waldin presented the programming summary and a list of upcoming programs in the Verdant Community Wellness Center (VCWC) (E:27:15).

### Marketing Report

Ms. Piplic presented the Marketing report (E:28:15) which includes a report on VCWC promotion through web-based advertising, items for the next edition of The Canopy newsletter which will be distributed in mid-May 2015, and upcoming events.

## Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Williams thanked Mr. Kosovich and Ms. Waldin for attending the Swedish Edmonds medical staff meeting on April 21, 2015 to present on classes offered at the VCWC. Commissioner Williams has also been asked to join a Swedish Medical task force on equity of care. He asked Superintendent Zapora to distribute a speech by the interim University of Washington president on diversity and equity.

Commissioner Langer commented that the public hospital district has heard the public comments on the former Woodway High School turf field but does not do any environmental studies and leaves that to the city and school district. The current funding will remain.

### Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Zapora provided an update on three items:

- 1. the list of upcoming training and meeting opportunities for the board members (E:29:15)
- 2. the change in leadership at Senior Services of Snohomish County and that he and Mr. Kosovich met with the interim ED, Carol Wheeler and the organization is well managed
- 3. working with Workforce Snohomish County to keep a Worksource office in south county

### Public Comments

Ms. Christi Davis, who said she has a PhD in health services research and policy shared her concerns on the health effects of artificial turf at the former Woodway High School field.

Ms. Annie Pankiewicz of WAHA expressed her gratitude for the office space and the connections made since being at the VCWC.

Mr. Al Rutledge asked for a plan for the next six months on events at the VCWC and asked for the amount spent in 2014 on grants and what will be spent in 2015.

Ms. Laura Johnson expressed her concerns about the health impacts of artificial turf at the former Woodway High School field.

Cade Johnson, a student at Edmonds Heights K12 expressed his love for the natural grass field and concerns about artificial turf.

Ms. Rowena Miller of the League of Women Voters commented that she is glad to hear that the issue of homelessness is being addressed by the medical advisory committee and that the public has the opportunity to address the Woodway High School field turf issue. She would like to see programs that focus on homelessness. Sierra Johnson, a student at Edmonds Heights K12, also expressed her concerns about the Woodway High School field and that local student's ability to learn would not benefit from the project.

Executive Session

President Langer recessed the regular meeting at 8:53 a.m. into Executive Session to review the Superintendent's performance and goals.

President Langer stated that the board would reconvene in 15 minutes and no action would be taken in Executive Session.

Open Session

The board reconvened into Open Session at 9:06 a.m. and approved the Superintendent Goals.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to discuss and approve Superintendent Zapora's 2015 goals.

Adjourn

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 9:07 a.m.

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

### **Monthly Highlights** March 2015

Verdant received dividends payments of \$39,233 and an unrealized gain of \$58,230 on our investment portfolio in March. The District portfolio closed with an ending market value of \$31,599,425.

Annual program commitments total \$5,974,036 and \$4,558,065 for 2015 and 2016, respectively. \$1,125,964 remains available to spend in 2015, of which \$282,150 is earmarked as Superintendent Discretionary.

Additional income of \$91,145 and expenses of \$32,792 from the Kruger Clinic were incurred, netting to an additional operating income of \$58,353 in March.

Figures are preliminary and may change due to year end adjustments.

### **April 2015 Program Committee Summary**

### **Program Summary**

- Five application requests up for discussion:
  - Four new funding requests
  - o One renewal request

### **Applications Recommended for Funding**

• Edmonds Community College – Celebration of Food Festival: a one-time request of \$5,000 for a fourth annual Celebration of Food Event. The May 2015 event at the Lynnwood Convention Center includes cooking demonstrations and booths from local farmers and gardeners. In 2014 and 2013, Verdant provided \$5,000 in funding and the event was attended by approximately 1,350 people. The program committee is recommending funding the request in full at \$5,000 on a one-time basis.

### **Not Recommended for Funding**

- Washington State University Extension FoodSense: a multi-year request for a total of \$477,000 to implement the FoodSense nutrition education curriculum in the Edmonds School District. The program would expect to serve 2,000 students per year, and funds would primarily be used for WSU staffing and program administration. The program committee is not recommending funding the program at this time because the project is relatively expensive and the Edmonds School District has not yet embraced the project.
- Rotary Club of Edmonds Edmonds Waterfront Festival: a \$7,500 request to fund the annual Edmonds
   Waterfront Festival in May 2015. Through sponsorship support, Verdant would be provided with a
   prominent presence and other means (program, print media, etc.) to share its programs and priorities. The
   program committee is not recommending funding the program at this time; although it is a large
   community event, the festival is not particularly connected to health.
- Sound Health Physicians Diabetes Program: a multi-year request from a Lynnwood medical clinic to support patients dealing with diabetes. Verdant funding would be used to enhance the service provided for a pilot study of 12 patients and then expand to 50 patients per quarter. The program would include support from a dietitian, personal trainer, and a licensed social worker through small group and individual meetings. The concept is that Verdant funds would be used to fund more comprehensive services that are not covered by insurance.

The program committee is not recommending funding the program at this time because the program is more focused on disease management than Verdant typically funds and the project is built around a single clinical practice. The committee felt this type of project could and should be supported by insurance or potentially pharmaceutical companies.

### **Program Renewal Request**

• Senior Services of Snohomish County - Care Coordination: a renewal request for a program that integrates care coordination between Swedish/Edmonds and community services for adults. The program exceeded its goal for referrals in the 2nd and 3rd year of the program. Outcomes tracked include patients' ability to manage their conditions, follow up with primary care, and access to other resources. The program has also been tracking reductions in readmissions.

The program committee is recommending funding the project in full at \$135,000 per year for two additional years. The committee felt that program has been successful and fits well with Verdant priorities, but they would like to clearly communicate to Senior Services that we may revisit the program scope if there are similar programs funded through managed care organizations or through Accountable Communities of Health project. If approved, the funding agreement would need to give Verdant the flexibility to terminate or rework the program scope.
