Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, was called to order at 8:01 a.m. by President Knutsen.

Approval of Minutes

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on

June 28, 2017.

Executive Committee

President Knutsen reported that the Executive Committee met on July 19, 2017 to review and

approve the July 26, 2017 board meeting agenda, and

the July 26, 2017 Strategic Collaboration Meeting

agenda. No action was taken.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Fenn updated on the board on several items:

- 1. AWPHD conference in June 2017 had an impressive speaker on community health issues.
- 2. Dr. Fenn met with Congressman Rick Larsen to discuss proposed cuts to SNAP & WIC programs.

- She will be meeting with a representative from the Congressman's office in the future.
- 3. Presentation on data for the Value Village property discussion is on hold until the August 2017 board meeting.
- 4. The Edmonds City Council has invited Verdant to do a presentation at their September 5, 2017 council meeting. Commissioners are invited to participate.
- 5. Bond 101 training meeting with Piper Jaffrey is scheduled for August 8, 2017, 11 a.m. to 12 p.m. at Verdant. Commissioners are invited to attend.
- 6. The financial information will be condensed for presentation at regular board meetings with a quarterly deeper review. Commissioners should let Dr. Fenn or Ms. King know what information they would like presented at board meetings.
- 7. Dr. Fenn recognized several recent staff birthdays.

Review Grant Criteria

Dr. Fenn presented a 1st draft of grant criteria (E:51:17). After researching several other organization's grant criteria, it was found that most do not use strong, objective criteria; instead it is based on need at that time. Commissioners discussed the need to document the process for the State Auditors, use of a 100-point scale to check that funded programs are tied to our priority areas, include viability of funding for programs in the criteria, include measurement of health outcomes, and setting expectations about future funding. Commissioner Langer suggested including statutory RCW language in the criteria, as well as posting it on our website. He would like staff to pull this new criterion into upcoming grant renewals as well as new grant applications. Dr. Fenn and Mr. Kosovich will work on the next draft to be available for the next Program Committee meeting. After Program Committee review, the second draft will be sent to a few community partners for feedback. The draft will then go to the full board for approval in October with a proposed launch date of November 1, 2017. Further discussion will also be done at the December 2017 board retreat.

Finance Committee Report

The committee met on July 20, 2017. Ms. King reviewed the financial statements and cash activity for June 2017 (E:52:17). Ms. King is available to meet with any board members in a one-on-one meeting if they have more questions on district finances. Ms. King reminded commissioners of the October 18 Special Board Meeting at 8 a.m. to discuss the Superintendent's Proposed 2018 Budget and the October 25 Regular Board Meeting at 8 a.m. to approve the 2018 M&O Levy and the 2018 budget.

Authorization for Payment of Vouchers & Payroll

Warrant Numbers 12329 through 12376 for June 2017 for payment in the amount of \$78,710.75 were presented for approval (E:53:17). *Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve.*

Program Committee Update

The Program Committee met on July 13, 2017 to review one new application (E:54:17). Commissioner Knowles presented the committee recommendations of the review to the board.

No conflicts of interest were reported by any of the commissioners present.

Applications Recommended for Funding:

Center for Human Services Youth Counseling Program – a renewal request to continue funding for the youth counseling program that supports mental health counselors in the Edmonds School District secondary schools.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve funding the program at \$225,000 per year for two more years, a 36% increase from the current level and this would enable CHS to add a third counselor supported by Verdant.

Presentation from Veterans Services of Snohomish County

Jerry Gadek shared what Veterans Services does to support veterans in the community with needs such as housing, health care, and employment. He highlighted the need for more engagement of younger veterans, spouses of veterans, support for victims of sexual assault, and traumatic brain injury survivors.

- 3. Superintendent goals were sent to commissioners. Dr. Fenn is awaiting feedback or questions from commissioners.
- 4. Dr. Fenn met twice with Congressman Rick Larsen and members of his team.
- 5. Ms. Piplic is initiating conversations with local media Re: future coverage of programs and columns contributed by Verdant.
- 6. Ms. King arranged Bond 101 training with Piper Jaffrey on August 8, 2017. Dr. Williams attended. Dr. Williams provided a brief summary to the other commissioners of options available should the District consider issuing bonds for a future project.

Point of Order was called by Commissioner Langer asking that staff contact legal counsel to confirm that quorum was not in attendance by the inclusion of commissioners participating in the meeting telephonically. Staff and commissioners agreed that no business would be conducted, as three commissioners were not present in-person. Commissioner Langer asked that we look into possible bylaw amendments allowing for quorum to be present if commissioners join the meeting telephonically.

Program Committee Update

Senior Center and he looks forward to this relationship continuing with this third renewal request for funding.

Value Village Discussion

Patrick Doherty presented the Edmonds Highway 99 Subarea Plan (E:60:17), which was approved by Edmonds City Council recently. He said the development of this plan took a year and a half and included many stakeholders. The intent is to change the corridor into a full-service community, where people can live, shop, and work, and he outlined the different areas of the plan, including the Health Care District that includes the hospital.

Commissioner Knowles asked if there are details regarding the city's goal for the health care corridor.

Mr. Doherty shared that the city's vision for mixed use development along Highway 99 applied to the Health Care District as well as the other areas. The city would like to see both residential and retail in the Health Care District as well as other direct healthcare services.

Dr. Fenn asked about the level of interest among developers at this time, related to both housing and healthcare. Mr. Doherty said that there have been three developers who have expressed interest in housing and no direct requests or preapplications related to medical services, but there has been some interest. He encouraged staff and commissioners to stay engaged in this work and consider attending an October open house to learn more, although the specific date and time for the open house is TBD.

Program Funding Requests

Applications Recommended for Funding

1. Edmonds Senior Center — Enhancing Health & Wellness Programs: a renewal request for health programs at the Edmonds Senior Center. The renewal program request would continue the major programs and services and add some new program extensions. The programs to be continued include the Enhance Wellness Program in partnership with Sound Generations, PEARLS (for depression) in partnership with the University of Washington Health Promotion Research Center, Living Well with Chronic Conditions (Diabetes/Pain), Palliative/End of Life Care, Support Groups, Brain Health and Cognitive Training classes.

The core programs (PEARLs, Enhance Wellness, Chronic Disease Management) are evidence-based programs and are on track to meet their performance goals for the 3-year period. The senior center requested an average of \$127,000 per year and the program is currently funded at \$110,000 per year.

The program committee is recommending partially funding the request at an average of \$116,000 per year for the next three years.

- 2. Cities of Lynnwood, Edmonds, and Mountlake Terrace Swim Lesson Program: a renewal request for a swim lesson program with three city-operated pools (Mountlake Terrace, Edmonds/Yost, and the City of Lynnwood Recreation Center). The current program provided 3 sets of swim lessons (10 ea.) to every third-grade student in the Edmonds School District. The program also includes in-classroom safety instruction from pool staff. The three cities are proposing a reworked model to target larger numbers on non-swimmers by:
 - Limiting the 3rd grade vouchers to basic swim instruction (would exclude more competitive lessons) and continuing the classroom education at 3rd grade.
 - Launching a new program to attract non-swimmers of all ages and provide any non-swimmer youth with swim lesson vouchers. The pools would offer quarterly water safety education/evaluation events where non-swimmers would be identified and provided with swimming vouchers.

Similar to the previous program model, Verdant would fund lessons only when vouchers are redeemed at a cost of \$8 per lesson, with a maximum of 30 lessons per child. The program committee is recommending funding the revised program—the committee felt that the program redesign would better target youth with low swimming abilities.

3. VaxPoint LLC dba Seattle Visiting Nurses Association — Flu Vaccine Program: a community vaccination program offered in South Snohomish County. Clinics are organized at community locations like food banks, schools, libraries, and the Edmonds Community College. When available, insurance is billed and Verdant

would pay for the cost of vaccines for individuals who do not present an insurance card. Last year 1,671 vaccinations were provided through the vaccine clinics at nearly 30 locations—insurance was billed for 1,205 (72%) with Verdant paying for the remaining 466.

The program committee is recommending funding the project again this year with one contingency—the committee was interested in having the clinics provide information and resources about health insurance enrollment. Verdant staff reached out to Seattle VNA and the clinic staff confirmed that they are open to sharing information about insurance enrollment at clinic sites.

Funding Applications Not Recommended for Funding:

4. Farmer Frog – Meadowdale Pocket Farm: a request for \$25,000 in funding to build a small "pocket" farm in Meadowdale Park. The space would be leased from the City of Lynnwood and would be used for school field trips, growing and harvesting produce for backpack programs, how-to-classes on growing and harvesting produce, etc. Verdant asked the organization to provide more detailed outcome data, and Farmer Frog provided very large estimated program outputs (ex. 25,000 adults educated and 15,000 families provided with food).

The program committee is not recommending funding at this time. Although the farm/community garden will provide a nice amenity the community, it is not clear that Farmer Frog has the capacity to track and measure health and education outcomes from programming.

5. Beecher's Pure Food Kids Foundation/Sound Food Uprising: a multi-year request averaging \$100,000 per year over three years to provide nutrition education to adults in South Snohomish County. The program is built around a two-session workshop focused on food, nutrition, and consumer power that encourages people to make better informed decisions about buying and consuming food. Using a mobile cart, the program can be delivered at flexible locations and teaches skills like food selection, knife skills, and batch cooking. The applicant estimates that 850 individuals would be trained in year 1, growing to 1,420 by year 3.

The program committee is not recommending the program for funding. Although the curriculum has been vetted through Swedish clinical faculty, it is still in "beta" phase and largely unproven in generating health outcomes.

6. ChildStrive – Building a Resilient South Snohomish County: a multi-request of \$325,000 per year for a comprehensive program to support building resilient families. The long-term goals of the program are to increase parenting skills, positive child development, and increased family resiliency. Grant funds would be used to support early intervention and Parents as Teachers Program, add community engagement staff, and add a restorative practices and mindfulness specialists.

The program committee is not recommending the program for funding. Although the committee supports the long-term goals of the program, they did not see enough evidence that the focus on restorative practices and mindfulness would directly lead to improved measures of family resiliency, positive child development, or a decrease in child abuse.

Follow-up On Grant Evaluation Process

The program committee had a follow-up discussion following the August board meeting about grant evaluation. The committee is recommending the following roll-out process:

October

- Board Meeting: staff present final draft of evaluation criteria for board member feedback and public comment
- Staff to send draft to other health funders for feedback
- Host a "Funder's Panel" where Verdant shares the evaluation criteria and collects feedback

November

- Board Meeting: Board ratifies final criteria and evaluation process
- Application materials updated and posted for new applications in 2018

- The impact of the current political situation on stress levels for youth at schools and the impact on their learning abilities or their use of drugs and alcohol to cope. Maybe in house support (as in at the schools) in a way that doesn't single anyone out.
- More in the area of youth mental health support, including one-time sessions for parents around specific issues or topics. What are we seeing that's causing stress for youth, and therefore impacting parents, and what can we do about it?

- Open to all possibilities, but don't think we should operate a facility of any kind.

Staff:

- Youth behavioral health, inpatient or space for counseling and group sessions (or both?) Preferably a place run by another organization. I don't think we want to manage usage (if there are scheduling needs) in another facility, at least not without staffing support.
- Integrated community programs with a focus on behavioral health
- 1. A drop-off center for people under the influence. This is where law enforcement could bring someone who was high or inebriated instead of taking them to the ER or jail. It could be attached to a detox center that offered detox for adults and youth. Would also have counseling rooms where providers could do AOD/MH treatment.
 2. A larger version of VCWC but with an upstairs that is leased out or given to providers including a women's health clinic or a clinic that focuses on veterans' health issues.
 NOT a hotel. NOT a MOB. NOT apartments.
- Behavioral Health Services for youth and adults Learning Lab to support lifestyle changes for chronic disease prevention to include culinary instruction, nutrition education, exercise, mindfulness, and personalized health coaching. Idea based on research out of Harvard School of Public Health
- Something that will benefit the community that pays taxes into the PHD2; not something for other service providers.
- Facility with a Behavioral/Mental Health Focus including Substance Abuse for Youth or Seniors
