Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, was called to order at 8:00 a.m. by President Knutsen.

Approval of Minutes

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve the minutes of the regular board meeting on February 27, 2019.

Superintendent Report Dr. Fenn reported on the following items:

- 1. Domestic Violence Services will hold an open house at their new facility on April 25, 2019, 3 to 6 p.m. at 4232 198th St. SW, Lynnwood and the commissioners are invited.
- The Lynnwood City Council decided not to move forward with the purchase of the Rodeo Inn. City Council may consider other properties for this project.
- 3. The Snohomish Health District is recognizing Ms. Waldin as a health champion for infant and

maternal health (E:11:19). The health district's burden of disease report has been released and Dr. Fenn will invite Jeff Ketchel of the Snohomish Health District to the April 24, 2019 board meeting to present the report to the board.

- 4. The commissioners present approved December 6 to 7, 2019 for a board retreat at Tulalip Resort Casino and confirmed they will all be available to attend. Staff will secure the reservations.
- 5. The Provider Open House at Verdant was held on March 21, 2019.

Executive Committee Report

The committee met on March 20, 2019 via telephone to review the agenda for the March 27, 2019 board meeting and the executive session topic which includes public employee evaluation. This evaluation will include board surveys, then a time for the board to summarize the evaluation, then meet with the public employee in Executive Session, and finally the board will approve the public employee compensation in Open Session.

Finance Committee Report

The committee met on March 19, 2019. Ms. King reviewed the financial statements and cash activity for February 2019 (E:12:19) and called out the receipt of a 2004 Medicare settlement in the amount of \$10,702. Commissioner Knowles inquired on the status of the space for rent at the Kruger Clinic. Ms. King reported that the potential tenant is still considering the space.

Authorization for Payment of Vouchers & Payroll

Warrant Numbers 13430 through 13474 for February 2019 for payment in the amount of \$65,509.67 were presented for approval (E:13:19) by Commissioner Distelhorst. *Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve.*

Program Committee Update

The Program Committee met on March 18, 2019 to review three programs, follow-up on myStrength web/mobile-based behavioral health program, and follow-up on sustainability discussion from the board retreat (E:14:19).

Commissioner Knowles asked if there were any conflicts of interest. Commissioner Distelhorst commented that he served on the board of the Edmonds Senior Center

and resigned after he was appointed to the board of PHD #2. No conflicts of interest were identified.

Mr. Kosovich presented a summary of each of the three programs and Commissioner Knowles presented the committee recommendations to the board.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve \$15,585 for one year for the Compass Health Youth Mental Health Partnership, a program that will provide youth mental health training to families at the Alderwood and Edmonds Boys & Girls Club sites. The program includes youth mental health first aid and other behavioral health presentations on topics such as anxiety, bullying and signs of suicide.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve \$52,250 for one year for the Compass Health Emergency Voucher Program Expansion, a program that provides short-term motel assistance to individuals and families. The program has been operating for 12 years and would specifically target South County individuals being discharged from the hospital with no shelter to provide short-term (two weeks) motel vouchers. Domestic violence issues would be referred to DVS for assistance but if their shelter is full, DVS would provide these motel vouchers as well. Commissioners would like the program to specifically target people with significant health needs, mental health needs, and/or people who are being discharged from Swedish Edmonds.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve the Edmonds Senior Center nutrition program in the amount of \$21,000 in Year 1, \$165,000 in Year 2, and \$9,000 in Year 3. Commissioners discussed with Edmonds Senior Center Director Farrell Fleming the funding amount needed to meet the health department requirements for the temporary meal program to operate out of Holy Trinity Church during the senior center construction. Director Fleming clarified that the Edmonds Senior Center will now be working with Homage Senior Services to cater the meals out of their Everett kitchen including three hot meals and two box lunches per week. Approximately \$10,000 would be

> used for equipment, vehicle use and driver costs and not for upgrades to the Holy Trinity Church kitchen.

Follow-up on myStrength

A presentation on this program will be given at the April 24, 2019 board meeting (E:15:19). Commissioner Distelhorst commented that this program attracts very few males, however mental health topics in general draw fewer men to in-person programs.

Grant Sustainability Criteria

Mr. Kosovich presented the summary (E:16:19) and the commissioners are comfortable with this summary.

VCWC Connection to Medical Providers

Ms. Waldin presented the Program Guide and health & wellness prescription pad to the board and explained how since 2015 Verdant has been developing and expanding programs for the broader population to support referrals from local health providers. Programs focus on lifestyle modification, weight management, and diabetes/pre-diabetes (E:17:19).

Commissioner Knutsen commented that items such as veterans' services should be included in the wellness navigation materials.

Commissioner Wilson commented that this program is best advertised through the local clinics and their medical assistants/nurses. She suggested lunch meetings at site clinics.

Program Committee Recommendations (Commissioners Knowles & Wilson)

Recommended for Funding:

• Compass Health – Youth Mental Health Partnership: the committee is recommending funding the program at \$15,585 for as a pilot for one year. The committee members were interested in the idea of supporting a partnership between Compass and the Boys and Girls Club with some focused training on mental health topics. 


The committee asked for some follow-up information on the two other programs that were referenced earlier.




Follow-up on myStrength: Web/mobile-based behavioral health program

- De Corazon a Corazon: This 6-month series will offer Spanish speaking community members
 education and information to be more aware of what they are eating and how to choose
 healthy foods; to be more aware of the amount of activity they do in a day; to stop selfdestructive thoughts and replace them with positives and to manage stress, social events and
 other people that make it difficult for them to change.
- King County Promotoras Network: Meeting of the group in King County that supports the efforts of the work of CHW (Promotoras) in Snohomish County. The Promotora model is a culturally sensitive, lay health educator for the Latina community.
- 7-week Spanish Language Positive Discipline Program for Parents and Youth 10-14 years: The
 Positive Discipline Program is geared towards parents and youth 10-14 teaching family skills
 designed to enhance school success and reduce youth substance use and aggression among 10to 14-year-olds. The first class started this month and we have 20 families enrolled.
