Call to Order	The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, was called to order at 9:03 a.m. by President Knowles.

Executive Session	President Knowles recessed the regular meeting at 9:35 a.m. into Executive Session to consider acquisition of Real Estate. President Knowles announced that Executive Session would last until approximately 9:45 a.m. and no action would be taken. Executive Session was extended one time by President Knowles until 9:55 a.m. Regular meeting reconvened at 9:55 a.m. No action was taken.

Superintendent Report

Dr. Edwards recognized Ms. Waldin, who is retiring and has been very instrumental in the success of Verdant. Ms. Reese is close to launching Fluxx, Verdant’s new Grant Portal. Fluxx training for staff and commissioners will take place in November. Ms. Piplic is working on Verdant’s new website, and a preview may be available in November. Dr. Edwards thanked Ms. Budd for her outreach efforts and the full team for their hard work. Several commissioners also thanked Ms. Waldin for everything she has done for Verdant and the community.

Commissioner Knowles reported that the Executive Committee met on Wednesday, October 20, 2021 to review the agenda for the October 27, 2021 board meeting.

The Finance Committee met on Tuesday, October 12, 2021. Ms. Keuser reviewed the financial statement and cash activity for September 2021 and noted anything over \$5,000 in payment from the warrants. (E:82:21)

Program grant commitments total \$6,946,462 for 2021 excluding BHCF. Additional 2021 funding for COVID-19 programs total \$955.5K.

Revenue of \$123.1K and expenses of \$92.9K from the Kruger Clinic were incurred, netting to an additional operating income of \$30.2K.



RESOLUTION NO. 2021-06

A RESOLUTION of the Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington (the “District”), determining certain personal property to be surplus and no longer required for public hospital district purposes of the District and authorizing the superintendent and such District personnel as the superintendent may designate to sell all or any part of such property on a negotiated basis.

AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE COVID-19 RESPONSE: AFGHAN FAMILY NAVIGATION PROGRAM

This Agreement is made between Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington and the REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST to provide a COVID-19 Response Program.

1. PARTIES

1.1 Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington (“PHD2”), a public hospital district formed under Chapter 70.44 RCW; and

1.2 REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST, a Washington State non-profit organization.

2. PURPOSE AND PROGRAM

2.1 The purpose of this Agreement is to enable REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST to provide a COVID-19 Response Program (“the Program”) for the benefit of PHD2 residents.

2.2 Gov. Jay Inslee declared a State of Emergency Proclamation on July 1, 2020 that remains in effect. In response to COVID 19 and this proclamation, The Program is designed to: support recently arrived Afghani families settling in South Snohomish County in accessing and implementing resources such as housing, food, preventive healthcare services, and enrollment of children in Head Start and Edmonds School District schools. An Afghani Community Navigator will be a settled Afghani individual who will support individuals and families in navigating the complex processes of gaining and using benefits and assisting them in selecting and utilizing primary medical, dental, and behavioral health homes as needed, identifying markets where they can utilize snap benefits to purchase culturally appropriate food items, providing 1:1 and group mentorship and support, and assuring that school-age children are enrolled in appropriate academic settings.

3. AUTHORITY

3.1 PHD2 is authorized under RCW 70.44.240 to “contract” with any “legal entity” to “provide any hospital or other health care facilities or other health care services to be used by individuals, districts, hospitals, or others, including providing health care maintenance services.” RCW 70.44.007 defines “other health care services” to include “services that promote health, wellness, and prevention of illness and injury.”

3.2 The REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST is established with a mission to empower refugees, immigrants and their families to become self-sufficient and healthy, contributing members of society.

4. TERM AND TERMINATION

4.1 The Agreement will begin on the date of the second signature on this Agreement.

4.2 The period for providing the Program is scheduled to begin on November 1, 2021 and continue through December 31, 2021.

4.3 The Agreement will end when the final reporting by the REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST is accepted and approved by PHD2.

5. OBLIGATIONS OF PHD2

5.1 PHD2 will fund the Program provided by REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST based on the following budget. Variances of more than 10% on a budget line item must be approved by PHD2 in writing.

5.2 PHD2 will fund the COVID-19 Response AFGHAN FAMILY NAVIGATION PROGRAM provided by REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST as a single payment of fifteen thousand dollars and no cents (\$15,000) to be paid on November 15, 2021.

5.3 Templates for required reporting by REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will be provided to REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST by PHD2.

6. OBLIGATIONS OF REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST

6.1 REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will coordinate the Program including: supporting recently arrived Afghani families settling in South Snohomish County in accessing and implementing resources such as housing, food, preventive healthcare services, and enrollment of children in Head Start and Edmonds School District schools. An Afghani Community Navigator will be a settled Afghani individual who will support individuals

and families in navigating the complex processes of gaining and using benefits and assisting them in selecting and utilizing primary medical, dental, and behavioral health homes as needed, identifying markets where they can utilize snap benefits to purchase culturally appropriate food items, providing 1:1 and group mentorship and support, and assuring that school-age children are enrolled in appropriate academic settings.

6.2 REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will submit a report of activities carried out under the Program including summaries of results to PHD2 by January 31, 2022. At a minimum, REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will track and report to PHD2 the following and any other relevant tracking data collected and compiled by REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST during the course and scope of the Program.

REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will make itself available for virtual conversations on progress toward achieving the outcomes listed in this Agreement at the request of PHD2.

6.3 REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will comply with all local, state and federal laws including, if applicable, the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (“HIPAA”).

6.4 REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will use the funds provided by PHD2 only for the Program and will return any portion of the payments that are not used for the Program on or before delivery of the report due on January 31, 2022.

6.5 REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will give credit (logo or language) to PHD2 (“Verdant”) in its publicity vehicles about this program, including, but not limited to, press releases, annual reports, newsletters, websites, brochures and fliers. Credit should also be given in newspaper interviews about the program. Electronic communications/websites should also include a link to PHD2’s website. The use of PHD2’s logo, when appropriate, is encouraged. PHD2 can provide black-and-white or color versions in digital format.

6.6 REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST recognizes that PHD2 is a public agency subject to audit by the Washington State Auditor. REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will provide PHD2 with any accessible information that PHD2 is requested to provide to the Washington State Auditor or otherwise required to provide to the State of Washington or to the Federal Government or pursuant to the Washington Public Records Act. Such information typically includes this Agreement, REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST budget tracking regarding the use of PHD2 funds, and tracking records supporting the outcomes reported to PHD2 pursuant to this Agreement.

6.7 If REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST determines a breach of this Agreement has occurred, that is, JKF has failed to comply with any terms or conditions of this Agreement or has failed to provide in any manner the work or services agreed to herein, REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will notify PHD2 in writing of the nature of the breach within fourteen (14) calendar days if the deliverables are not on track to be met as anticipated. REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will develop a corrective action plan within fourteen (14) calendar days of delivering notice of the nature of the breach and will specify the proposed completion date for bringing the Agreement into compliance. Determination of sufficiency of the corrective action plan shall be at the sole discretion of PHD2. In the event a corrective action plan isn't submitted, or the plan is determined by PHD2 to be insufficient, PHD2 reserves the right to suspend or terminate this Agreement for performance or other reasons solely at the discretion of PHD2.

7. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

7.1 Relationship of the Parties. The relationship created between PHD2 and REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST in this Agreement is strictly that of independent contractors. The Agreement creates no partnership or joint venture between the parties, nor may any officer or employee of one party be considered to be an employee or agent of the other. Further, the Agreement provides no rights to any third parties and may not be relied on by any other person or entity.

7.2 Applicable Law. The Agreement is entered under the laws of the State of Washington. Any litigation arising from this Agreement must be filed in Snohomish County Superior Court.

7.3 Liability and Insurance. REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will indemnify, defend and hold PHD2 harmless from any claims, lawsuits or other actions, and judgments arising in any way from the Program provided under this Agreement. REFUGEE & IMMIGRANT SERVICES NORTHWEST will maintain a liability insurance policy of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence during the term of the Agreement and provide proof of coverage upon request of PHD2.

7.4 Entire Agreement; Amendments. This Agreement is complete and integrates all understandings between the parties. No amendment or other change to the Agreement will be binding on either party unless agreed to in writing and signed by each party.

7.5 Severability. If a court of competent jurisdiction rules any part of this Agreement to be invalid, the remainder of the Agreement will still be in full force and effect.

7.6 Force Majeure. Neither party will be in default or liable for failure to perform its obligations under this Agreement if that failure is due to causes beyond its reasonable control including, but not limited to, acts of God, acts of terrorism, fires, floods, windstorms earthquakes, labor disputes or governmental acts.





Verdant Community Social Worker Highlights: October/November 2021

- Case Management – continuing support for 13 clients.
- CHART Leadership and Facilitation – October 1, 2021, was the official date of transfer of services. I have continued to work closely with The Extra Step, to ensure a smooth transfer of services, warm handoff of clients, and commitment to supporting clients' progress.
- This past month included weekly team check ins, monthly staff meeting, DEI Team Meeting, monthly County Outreach Coalition, monthly Snohomish County Community Behavioral Health Committee, Snohomish County Connector's meeting, Snohomish County Vulnerable Task Force, and the Homeless Policy Task Force.
- I have worked 5.5 months at Swedish Edmonds, one day per week. I coordinate work between the psychiatric unit (9W), the emergency departments behavioral health assessment team (BHAT), and the hospital case management team. The goal is to begin to build rapport with clients before their discharges, in hopes of obtaining better health and wellness outcomes outside of the hospital setting. To date, 30 referrals since 6/01/21. Of 6 new referrals this month, 5 were consultations, and referred to more appropriate resources. 3 are unknown status at this time as they did not follow up with referral. As of today, I have 8 new active clients from this referral source, and 7 clients that have not followed through after discharge. One of the new referrals from this source passed away this past month.
- Community Training, November 9. Event title: Mental Health 101: Mental and Addiction Disorders. Of 57 registered, 27 attended. Very positive evaluations.
- Completed the final Accountable Communities of Health (ACH) report for the Medicaid Transformation Project, in which we included the CHART program as our main focus. We should be receiving our final payment in December.
- Coordinated and facilitated a panel discussion for the Edmonds College regarding HB 1310. The panel included SSCF&R, Lynnwood Police and county Designated Crisis Responder (DCR). This was in response to the colleges request on how to manage crisis situations at the college, should they arise. If anyone is interested in watching this, I did record it.
- With the increase in opioid related deaths, Verdant will be sponsoring several NARCAN trainings during 2022. In partnership with Snohomish County Human Services Opioid Outreach and Molina Health, we will provide three in person and one virtual training, and Molina will be providing free NARCAN to participants.
