- Kruger Clinic Suite 270 remains unoccupied until 9/1/21
- Verdant Healthier Communities conference cancelled in 2021
- Minimal programing and conference fees due to COVID-19
- Levy 1.0% annual increase over 2020 plus new construction and refunds
- Investment Income budgeted at \$600K (2020 projected = \$718K)
- Unrealized Gains budgeted at \$300K (2020 projected = \$1.4M)

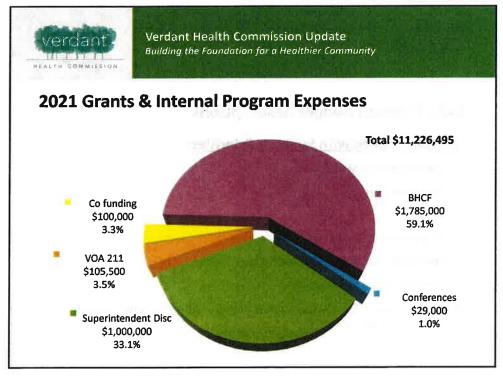


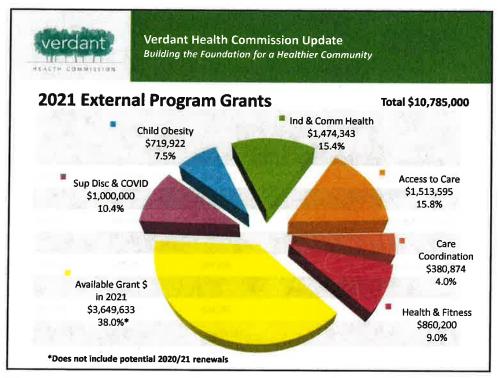


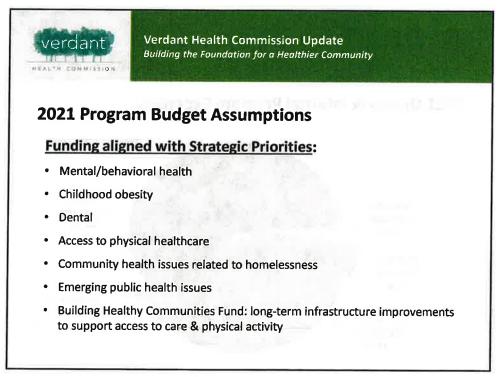
